## SYNERGISTIC ACTIVITIES (related to the integration and transfer of knowledge)

**Teaching and training:** *OCEANS GK-12 Teaching Fellowships* Greely provided graduate level scientists with the pre-professional skills to effectively (as measured via program evaluation) communicate and

teach ocean sciences to students and teachers in K-12 settings; *In-service Teacher Oceanography Workshops* served over 500 teachers and covered 12 ocean themes.

**Development curricular materials:** Co-developed, piloted, and evaluated over 150 middle and high school level lesson plans (e.g. Extreme Environments, Fun with Phages & Fluorescence) and in-class labs to demonstrate the role of the ocean in sciences and society; developed three-part series teaching manuals for the Oceanography Camp for Girl, NSF model science education program.

Broadening the participation of groups underrepresented in science through the Oceanography Camp for Girls, since 1991, which actively recruits, educates, and inspires *all* young women including minority and non-minority girls of all learning abilities (e.g. high achieving, average, and high potential). Over the past four years, the OCEANS Fellowship Program has supported 30 graduate scientist-teacher mentor teams (36% minority) to teach in 20 schools to over 5000 students (37% minority and 47% in free/reduced lunch programs). To date, the OCEANS program has enhanced science learning, teaching, and scores, and has also provided critically needed minority role models pursuing science and technology careers to encourage and inspire all students to participate in science.

**Development of a three-course series** on how to teach and communicate ocean sciences including pedagogical methods of inquiry and experiential learning for scientists and teachers

**Development of research tools in science education:** contributions to emerging research field of ocean literacy and reasoning about ocean issues; doctoral research findings provided baseline data for high school aged youth, as well as four ocean literacy instrument validated using Rasch model
